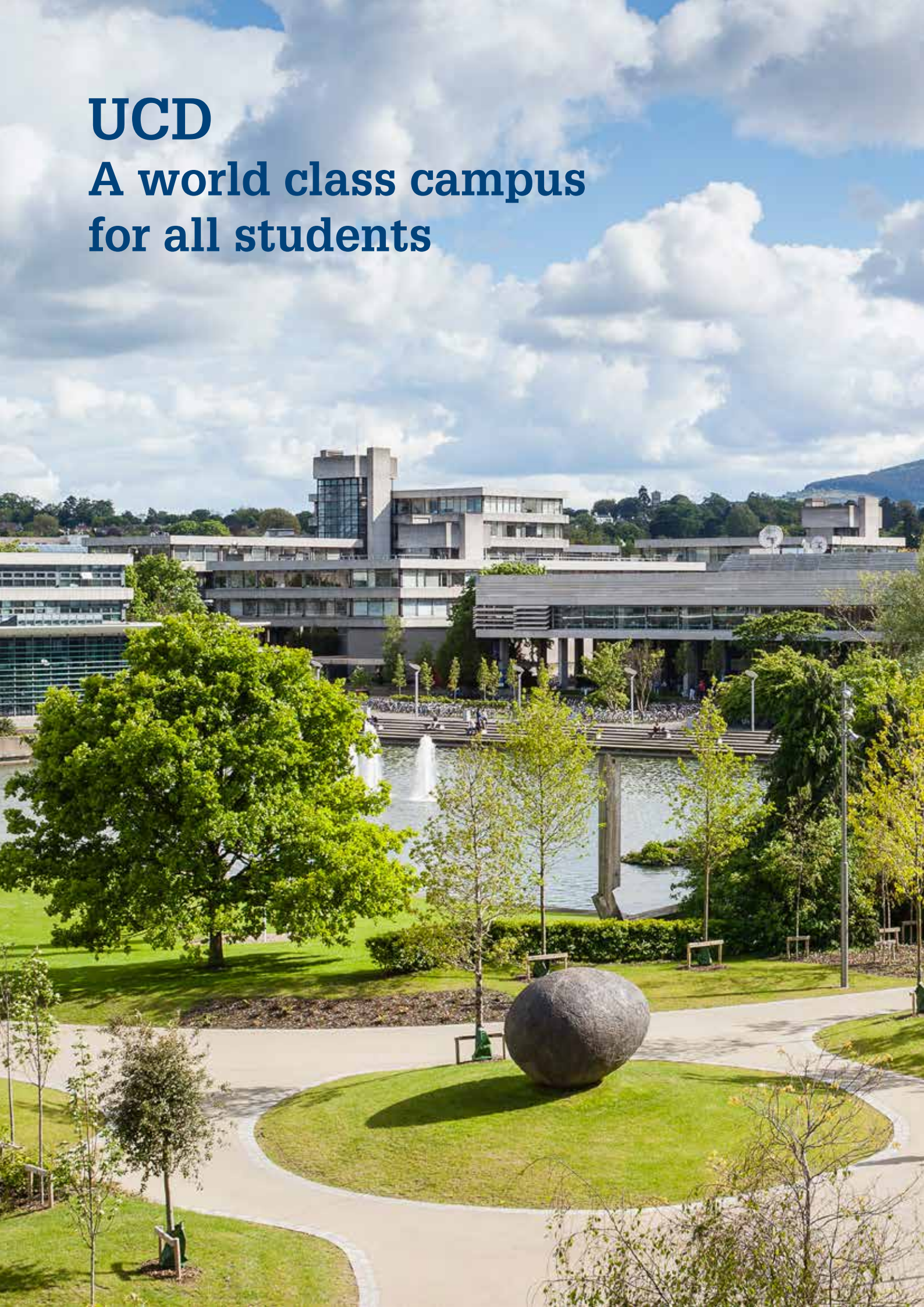

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MArch Pathways Programme Overview

School of Architecture, Planning & Environmental Policy

(One to four semesters in duration)

This programme is an entry route for applicants who do not have the BSc (Architectural Science) degree from UCD or an equivalent degree to fulfil the direct entry criteria for the Master of Architecture Degree Programme (MArch). The MArch Pathway programme provides an entry route for applicants who wish to pursue a career in the field of Architecture.

To enter the MArch Pathway programme, suitable applicants will be required to go through an interview process and to submit a portfolio to demonstrate their interest in the field of Architecture. Following the outcome of the interview process, the applicant will agree to undertake an individual curriculum of up to 120 credits from the existing modules of the BSc in Architectural Science (BHARCH001) degree. These modules will be determined by Negotiated Learning Agreement with the School on an individual basis. Students must successfully complete all required modules to be eligible to progress onto the Master of Architecture Degree Programme (MArch).

On the MArch Pathway programme, the student will accumulate the necessary required knowledge to register to the MArch programme, from basic drawing skills and model making to complex

architectural design solutions, individual interpretation and critical thinking on architectural issues. Technical, structural and environmental solutions to the student's design proposals etc are also covered. Depending on their prior learning the student may be requested to take modules within the discipline of Architecture such as History and Theory of Architecture; Building Construction and Technology and Structural and Environmental Behaviour which are offered as part of the BHARCH001 BSc (Architectural Science) programme.

Additional information on our Master of Architecture Degree Programme (MArch) at UCD Architecture

This two-year 120-ECTS credit programme fulfils the requirements for the second part of professional education in architecture (RIAI and RIBA Part II exempt). The School of Architecture, Planning

& Environmental Policy is in the process of pursuing Substantial Equivalency for the existing MArch Degree with the National Architectural Accrediting Board in the US. The MArch equips students to deal with complex design problems in challenging contexts. Through studio projects, academic writing and practical experiment it develops professional capacities while placing equal emphasis on research and critical enquiry. It situates architecture within a broader field of disciplines and influences. The programme is led by academics and practitioners at the forefront of the discipline. It encourages students to participate in and lead the development of a vital and critical culture of architecture.

(One to four semesters in duration)

This programme is an entry route for applicants who do not have an undergraduate degree in Landscape Architecture to fulfil the direct entry criteria for the Master of Landscape Architecture Degree Programme (MLA). The MLA Pathway programme provides an entry route for applicants who wish to pursue a career in Landscape Architecture.

To enter the MLA Pathway programme, suitable applicants will be required to go through an interview process and to submit a portfolio to demonstrate their interest in the field of Landscape Architecture. Following the outcome of the interview process, the applicant will agree to undertake an individual curriculum of up to 120 credits from the existing modules of the BSc in Landscape Architecture (BHARCH005) degree. These modules will be determined by Negotiated Learning Agreement with the School on an individual basis. Students must successfully complete all required modules to be eligible to progress onto the Master of Landscape Architecture Degree Programme (MLA).

On the MLA Pathway programme, the student will accumulate the knowledge required to register to the MLA programme, from basic drawing and spatial design skills to more complex landscape architectural design solutions, individual interpretation and critical thinking about landscape issues. Depending on prior learning students will take modules from within the discipline of Landscape Architecture such as History and Theory of Landscape Architecture; Landscape Ecology, Landscape Materials and Construction all of which are offered as part of the BHARCH005 BSc (Landscape Architecture) programme.

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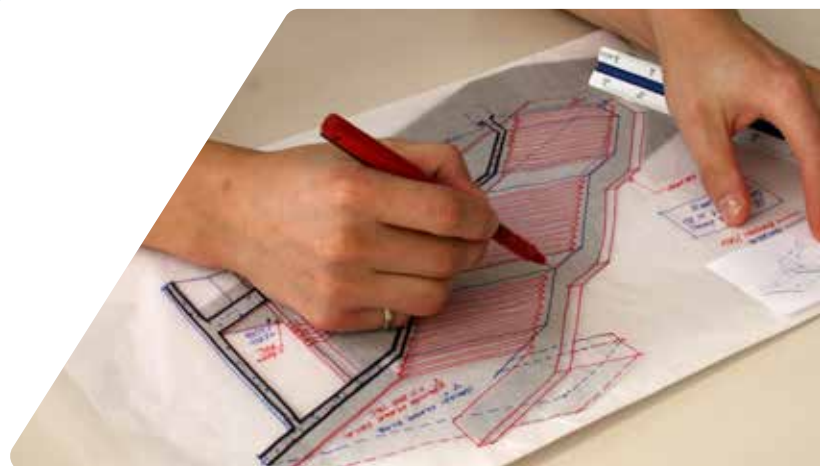
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
